



IN-STATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Premier scholarships available to Kansas graduating seniors who complete the general scholarship application (www.k-state.edu/sfa) before the **November 1** deadline:

Presidential	Awarded to National Merit semifinalists/finalists from Kansas, and National Achievement and National Hispanic Scholarship Program semifinalists/finalists from Kansas and out-of-state, \$7,000 per year renewable for 4 years with a minimum 3.5 K-State GPA.
Putnam	Awarded to students with a minimum 32 ACT (1410 SAT), 3.85 high school GPA, and top 10% of graduating class. \$7,000 per year for 4 years with a minimum 3.5 K-State GPA.
Foundation	Awarded to students with a minimum 29 ACT (1280 SAT), 3.6 high school GPA, and top 15% of graduating class. \$1,250 per year renewable with a 3.5 K-State GPA. Students with a 29 ACT will receive a \$1,000 freshman year only bonus (total of \$2,250 for freshman year). Students with a 30 and 31 ACT (1320-1400 SAT) will receive a \$2,500 freshman year only bonus (total of \$3,750 for freshman year).
Leadership	Awarded to students with a minimum 26 ACT (1170 SAT), top 1/3 of graduating class, and strong leadership in high school, church and community. \$3,000 for freshman year.
Medallion	Awarded to students with a minimum 26 ACT (1170 SAT), 3.6 high school GPA, and strong involvement in high school, church and community activities. \$2,000 for freshman year.
Achievement	Awarded to students with a minimum 23 ACT (1060 SAT), top 1/3 of graduating class, and strong leadership in high school, church and community activities. \$1,500 for freshman year.
Activity	Awarded to students with a minimum 3.0 high school GPA, and strong leadership in high school, church and community activities. \$1,000 for freshman year.
Fairchild	Awarded to students with a 26-28 ACT (1170-1270 SAT) and 3.75 high school GPA. \$1,000 for freshman year.
First in Class Guarantee	<p>Not a separate scholarship, only a guarantee of a certain amount of scholarship assistance from K-State (any combination of general university, departmental, or college level scholarships).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• If 25 ACT (1130 SAT) or above and ranked #1 in high school class, guaranteed a minimum of \$3,000 in K-State scholarship assistance.• If 24 ACT (1090 SAT) or below and ranked #1 in high school class, guaranteed a minimum of \$1,500 in K-State scholarship assistance.
International Baccalaureate	If you complete an International Baccalaureate diploma upon graduation you may be eligible for an additional \$1,000 scholarship award. Provide diploma documentation to Student Financial Assistance at finaid@k-state.edu



IMPORTANT DATES TO REMEMBER

We hope your year is off to a great start. Here is a checklist so you can make sure that you are getting everything done in order to become a Wildcat!

After July 1

- Apply for Admissions.** You can apply the summer after your junior year or ASAP during your senior year. The application can be filled out online at <http://consider.k-state.edu/apply>. There is a \$30 application fee.
- Send in your official high school transcript.** After applying, ask your school to mail or fax your transcript to:

- ***Transcript must include 6th semester grades and senior year class schedule.
- Apply for Scholarships.** The scholarship application can be completed at the same time you submit your admissions application or it can be found online at <http://www.k-state.edu/sfa/scholarships>.

After being Admitted

- Set up you K-State eID.** Your eID will be used for your email account and student information account. Go to <http://eid.k-state.edu> to set up your eID. You will need your WID (Wildcat ID number), which was listed on your acceptance letter.
- Fill out and return your housing application.** Apply online at <http://housing.k-state.edu>. There is a \$30 application fee (separate from your Admissions application fee).

October

- Take the ACT** (if you have not already). Send your official ACT score to K-State by entering the college code for K-State (1428) on the test registration form. For test dates and locations visit www.ACT.org.

November

November 1 - Priority deadline to complete K-State's scholarship application.

December

- Complete your housing contract and roommate profile.** Housing and Dining Services will begin emailing housing contracts after December 1 for those who completed the application. Room assignments are given on a first come, first serve basis so fill out the contract and roommate profile online, and submit the \$400 housing deposit, as soon as possible to ensure your room choice in the residence halls. Call Housing & Dining Services at 1-888-568-5027 if you have questions.
***Housing deposit fee goes towards cost of residence halls and is 100% refundable until June 1st

January

- Submit the FAFSA** (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. When applying online, you will need a PIN number which you will want to register for early. The K-State Federal Code that you need to put on the FAFSA is **001928**. If you have questions, contact your high school counselor or the K-State financial aid office at 1-877-817-2287.
*****PRIORITY DEADLINE TO SUBMIT APPLICATION IS MARCH 1 OF YOUR SENIOR YEAR**

February

February 1 – College and departmental scholarship deadline (if you already filled out the K-State scholarship application, it will automatically be forwarded onto the academic college/department you listed on your admissions application).

February 1 – Selective admissions deadline for the College of Architecture, Planning & Design, Interior Design (College of Human Ecology), and Wildlife and Outdoor Enterprise Management Program (College of Agriculture).

March

March 1 – Priority deadline to complete the FAFSA

April

- The Office of Student Financial Assistance will begin e-mailing Student Financial Award letters to those who met the March 1st deadline. Award letters will be mailed at a later date for those who did not meet the priority deadline. Remember to accept or decline award in your student account in iSIS.

Orientation and Enrollment and Wildcat Warm-up registration information will be sent to you. Be sure to pre-register! If you have not yet done so, set up your eID once you have been admitted to K-State.

June

June 1 – Request to cancel housing contract for full refund must be postmarked by June 1st.
