# HIGH SCHOOL GIRLS' TENNIS GOES TO STATE!

The Wellington Ladies Tennis Team took part the 4A state in Winfield tournament in with Wellington qualifying all 6 players. This was the first time since 2010 the entire tennis team qualified, and only the third time in school history the whole team qualified. Those qualifying were juniors Abby Lowe and Lexi Saffell in singles, senior Lauryn Snipes with junior Avery Rusk in doubles, along with junior Mekenna Adams and freshman Kylie Aufdengarten in doubles. Wellington placed 9th overall out of 21 teams represented at state. Mekenna Adams and Kylie Aufdengarten finished 5th overall out of the 24 doubles teams.

> Mekenna Adams is a three time state qualifier and the only female to win a medal at state her first three years. 9th - freshman year, 7th - sophomore

year, 5th - junior year.

- Adams now has 80 wins in her career moving her into 5th overall for the most wins in 3 years.
- Aufdengarten was the highest placing freshman in the state tennis tournament this year and is the highest placing freshman in WHS history. Adams is the only freshman in WHS history to medal.

### SCHOOL BOARD CONSIDERS NEW TECHNOLOGY INITIATIVE

The USD 353 Board of Education during the Oct. meeting, discussed the possibility of implementing a One to One Initiative at Wellington Middle School in the fall of 2017.

A One to One Initiative refers to one technology device (typically a laptop) per student. According to district superintendent Mark Whitener, the board is intent on preparing every student to be successful in a digital world.

Regardless of the path students take once they graduate high school, they will be expected to be technologically literate. Universities and trade schools alike operate almost exclusively from digital platforms.

The board is considering implementing the One to One Initiative at the Middle School first and then at the High School the following year. Eventually, the district hopes to have a device for every student in grades k-12.

The board is slated to take action on the technology initiative at the next meeting on November  $10^{th}$  at 7:00 p.m. The community is always welcome at board meetings.

### Multi-Tiered Systems of Support-(MTSS)

The Kansas State Department of Education encourages each district to implement a system for identifying students that need extra support in math, reading, and behavior. Each school gives specific assessments several times throughout the year to determine student's level each of proficiency. If a student has not reached grade level proficiency in a specific area, team of а professionals in the school examine the data and determine if the student needs tutoring.

The MTSS program has three levels with the third level providing the most intensive intervention. For instance, in a tier three intervention, the teacher may tutor students in a group of 2 or 3. This allows the teacher to give students more individual attention. (MTSS continued from p. 2)

The goal of the tutoring program is to quickly identify students who need help and thereby prevent school failure. If you would like to learn more about the MTSS program in your school, contact your principal or your child's
