- 2. Approved rescheduling February Regular Board Meeting to Monday, Feb. 13th. The superintendent is scheduled to be in Kansas City for the Kansas/Missouri Superintendent's Forum Feb. 8-10, which falls during the Feb. regular board meeting. Discussion Items

High School Exterior Lighting

The board discussed a proposal from the Bond Project architect to replace exterior lighting on the high school parking lot. The board opted to have one pole illuminated with new LED lights as a test before replacing all exterior lighting.

ADA Playground

The board discussed options for making playgrounds at the elementary schools ADA accessible. The board examined a rendering of an ADA playground recently installed at Futures Unlimited. Some board members will examine the Futures' playground when the weather improves.

Reports

The board heard a financial report from Mr. Morris on the district finances. Mr. Morris reported the district finances are stable and the district recently received \$25,000 from an area wind farm.

Mr. Whitener reported on progress toward the district's one to one computer initiative set to kick off in the fall of 2017 at the middle school. Administrators and teachers recently visited Winfield and Ark City to gather information about these districts' one to one initiatives. Whitener also reported the district will be rolling out professional development for teachers regarding implementation of the one to one initiative this spring.
