Your student will also have a dedicated mentor they will meet with 1:1 regularly, who will know them deeply and support them in setting and achieving their personal goals.

There will be also a focus on developing what we call 'Self-direction' - an invaluable skill that can be applied to any task in the adult world. Your student will learn how to set goals, make plans, and reflect on their learning - a cycle of learning they can for all of their school work.
