CADCA Forum fun!

SCCDAT staff members Kiersten Theurer and Kori Boyd traveled to National Harbor, Maryland in early February to attend CADCA's 30th Annual National Leadership Forum. CADCA's 30th Annual Leadership Forum was the largest training event in CADCA's history with more than 3,300 attendees, including more than 500 youth. The event brought together a record number of change agents, working together on strategies to help transform their communities. There were over 100 adult and youth training sessions that made Forum the nation's most comprehensive and sophisticated event focused on primary prevention and the CADCA Model for Community Change. We also heard from some of our incredible advocates, youth and outstanding prevention leaders. It was a great conference and it shows that our country is headed in the right direction in the efforts of preventing substance use among our many communities!



STICKER SHOCK

Sticker shock is an underage drinking prevention campaign in which the Sumner County Community Drug Action Team and the Sumner County Youth Council students team up to reduce underage drinking by limiting youth access to alcohol. The goal is to educate adults who might provide alcohol to youth about the law that prohibits furnishing alcohol to those under the age of 21. Students from area high schools will provide bags with warning stickers placed on them to participating liquor stores as well as bottle hangers with similar warnings to be placed on multi-packs of beer, wine, liquor, and other alcoholic beverages. These stickers and bottle hangers warn purchasers that it is illegal to provide alcohol to minors and list the consequences for doing so. Sticker Shock will take place this spring across the communities of Sumner County.
