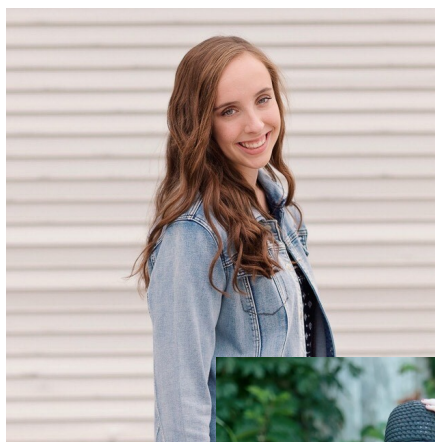
### Maggie McMinn


