



Tuesday, February 2nd

7th grade competitions will take place in rooms: B-1, B-2, B-5.

Schools Invited: Clearwater, Haysville West, Mulvane, Prairie Hills, Rose Hill, Wellington

Participants: Students will gather in the Commons until they hear the announcement for the start of the rounds.

Awards: There will be an awards ceremony in the Commons following the event.

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The rounds will consist of 17 questions consisting of Social Studies, Language Arts, Sciences, Math, Fine Arts, Miscellaneous, Technology, and Kansas History.

After a question is read, the teams have 10 seconds to ring in. Additional time may be announced for some math questions. The team members may discuss their answer until they ring in. No discussion may take place after the team has rung in. The member who rings the bell is expected to answer the question immediately. A team number must be recognized before answering. An answer given before recognition will be counted as incorrect. The other team will be given an opportunity to answer the question. If a team rings in and misses the answer, the other team has the opportunity to answer the question during the remaining time.

- A question involving units must have the correct units in the answer. In questions involving names, the last name will be sufficient unless necessary to differentiate, such as ROOSEVELT or JOHNSON.

- A correct answer is worth 10 points. If the question is interrupted and missed, 5 points are deducted. No other deductions will be made for wrong answers. If the round ends in a tie, the moderator and/or judge will select a tie-breaking question.

- Additional questions will be needed for replacement questions. If a question is misread or if an answer is accidentally given, a replacement question will be selected by the judge or moderator.

- All protests or challenges must be made by the captain of the team to the moderator and/or judge either at the time of the incident. The decision of the judge is final.

- If a problem arises with ties, it will be resolved in the following manner:

1. Win/Loss

2. Head to Head

3. Total Points

4. Margin of Victory (Only using the teams involved.)

ARTICLE VI - - 1100 - - Scholars' Bowl

6-1110 A fall season of competition will begin in October and go through the league meet on the third Thursday in November.

6-1115 All scholars' bowl competitions will begin at 3:30 P.M.

6-1120 The host school will be responsible for the arrangement of judges, timekeepers, scorers, moderator, buzzer equipment, and other needed items.

6-1122 Teams are asked to bring on set of buzzers to each competition.

6-1130 The host team will be responsible for preparing, ordering, and/or organizing the questions. The questions should cover the areas of English grammar, literature, math, geography, American history, world history, current events, science, arts and music, trivia, and other subjects appropriate for the grade levels. Questions for the Pioneer League Scholars' Bowl Tournament will be ordered/distributed by the league treasurer.

6-1140 Each school may enter two (2) teams, a 7th and 8th grade team. Each team may consist of 6 students. Five may play at a time. A player may be substituted between rounds.

6-1150 The competition will be a single round robin. The host school will determine the order depending on the number of teams attending.

6-1170 The host school will provide the rules and schedules for the other schools before the scholars' bowl competitions. Recommended starting time for all meets is 3:30 pm.
