### **REVIEW OF ROUGH DRAFT 2011-2012 USD 353**

Mr. Weiss presented a draft calendar for the 2011-2012 school year. This draft calendar basically follows the current year's calendar. The district calendar committee has not convened at this time. No action was taken

### **DRIVER TRAINING PROGRAM**

Mr. Weiss presented data regarding the Driver Education Program including current and possible funding and current fees of \$150 per student. No changes are anticipated for this summer however fees are subject to change depending on changes in the state's funding of such programs. No action was taken

### **ADMINISTRATOR REPORTS & SUPERINTENDENT COMMENTS:**

Kelly Adams acknowledged appreciation to the community in their efforts for a recent fundraiser for and Eisenhower student.

Counselor's Report - Kirsten Lymanroberson reported that the elementary counselors have continued education regarding bullying prevention. Churches continue to offer supplies for students. The counselors have made many referrals to outside services such as dental treatment, eye exams, Happy Feet, the food bank, etc.

Mr. Weiss discussed the number of school days missed due to inclement weather. He indicated that the USD 353 school year is accounted by total hours attended throughout the school year. At this time no make-up days are needed.

Mr. Weiss discussed legislature issues including the recent decisions by the Kansas Senate that has the potential to reduce the recommended cuts from \$75 per student to \$54 per student as well as funding the State's Maintenance of Effort responsibilities that would also save Federal funds from being lost. School funding for the 2011-2012 school year has not been finalized.

**BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS:**

David Peck discussed a work session to discuss further the ideas and concerns presented by patrons regarding the City of Wellington and the Wellington Recreation Commission.

Maria Cornejo discussed current legislation being considered to increase efforts regarding early detection of reading difficulties. Mrs. Cornejo discussed teacher Fusion pages on the district's website.

Robert White discussed a recent article in the Wichita Eagle regarding the elementary schools in the state. Washington Elementary was in the top 100.

Benny Ybarra discussed comparison of the gate fees for attending activities as they pertain to a discount for our senior citizens.

Jackie Barryman inquired about the grants currently being authored by the district to support the after school programs.
